Lawmaker to Request Return of Land Occupied by Mandalay USDP Office

22nd October 2016

Since the land occupied by the USDP Mandalay Region Head Office was transferred illegally, return of land to public would be asked again at the coming parliament session, claimed regional MP U Aung Shwe (Democratic Party Myanmar, Chan Aye Tharzan 1).

In 2002, since Union of Myanmar Wholesale Cooperative Federation transferred the land to USDP illegally, he requested to return the land at the regional hluttaw second session during last September. He did not find the Development Affairs Minister's response satisfactory. Thus he decided to submit it again to the Regional Hluttaw.

The land was transferred in accord with rules and regulations and the ownership title was obtained. The authorities made permission only because conditions were compliant, said U Win Maung, the Chairman of Mandalay Region USDP.

Independent Media Coverage of Shan State Hluttaw Restricted

20th October 2016

Independent media outlets covering the Shan State Hluttaw (parliament) in the state capital Taunggyi have been discriminated against and are being restricted in their coverage of the parliament.

Khun Zaw Oo from the Democratic Voice of Burma (DVB) said that the only media allowed to take photos and film video of the parliament during its sessions are the Information and Public Relations Department from the Ministry of Information and Myawady, MRTV, and SkyNet TV.

He said: "Independent media, who are not state-owned media, have to



cover the news from a TV placed inside a tent outside the parliament. The sound quality from the sound box is unclear. We can't take photos. The photos taken from the TV screen are of bad quality. This is especially bad for broadcasting media. We can't take

U Kyaw Thu Zaw, the director of the Parliament Office, said that the Information and Public Relations Department has to be allowed to cover news from inside the parliament because they have a duty to inform the public about what is happening in parliament, but that no other media organisations would be allowed in the parliament.

He said: "We have only allowed them [the Information and Public Relations Department] in because the parliament is very small. There is no space for observers from outside, even when broadcasting groups come to film inside the parliament. It is distracting for the parliamentary representatives."

According to Chapter 9 of the media by-law, the media shall have the right to acquire public information prescribed in the article (6), session (A). The media, by providing media identification card, also have access to documents and make copies of them without any payments excerpt the actual cost.

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Traffic Light Sensor System Questioned at the Region Hluttaw

Criticism arouse as a traffic control system of 154 traffic lights aimed at reducing gridlock in Yangon is still not in place though the regional government previously cliamed to start using it by the end of August.

MP U Wai Phyo Han (Insein 2) asked why the project was not finished and whether it was due to the financial condition of the companies tasked with the project. At the regional hluttaw on 19th October, Mayor U Maung Maung Soe pledged to review why the project was delayed and to inform the public.

"People are raising a lot of questions on the ongoing traffic jams. They are expected it by the end of August. So why is the project not finished? Why authorities gave pledges so easily if they knew the project would not be completed by this time? Our people hold high expectations of government for changes," said U Wai Phyo Han.

It is also learned from the government that it takes 38.92 billion kyats to build the traffic control centre of 154 traffic lights and to improve technical issues.
