Being Under Home Affairs Causes Difficulties for State/Region Hluttaw Offices



24th July 2016

The Deputy Speaker of Mandalay Region Hluttaw, Dr. Khin Maung Htay, claimed that hluttaw offices face difficulties since staffs are under Ministry of Home Affairs.

He added that hluttaw office staffs are supposed to provide necessary information to newly elected MPs, but difficulties arise since there are few competent staffs whereas the MPs themselves still do not have full understanding.

"A parliament should have its won budget. It will work if the parliament can pay salaries. Currently The Ministry of Home Affairs is paying salaries and also in charge of appointing, dismissing and promoting staffs", said U Tin Aung @ U Tint Swe, the chairman of the legislative committee.

At the moment Pyithu and Amotha Hluttaw Offices are able to pay salaries to their staffs and it is learned from the MP circle that the hluttaws group is taking measures in order to do so.

A Review by Yangon Region Hluttaw Committee for the Government on High-rise Buildings



27th July 2016

After Yangon Region Government ordered to review highrise buildings which were granted permit and were approved by the previous government, more than 200 buildings were suspended and 12 of them were ordered to reduce the numbers of floors.

The Finance, Economic and Planning Committee of the Yangon Region Hluttaw received complaints from 8 out of 12 affected developers. Since the complaints included developers' losses and out-of-work labourers from those construction projects, the committee carried out inspections, said Daw Sandar Min, the Committee Chairman.

It is known that the committee carried out ground-inspections and found no violations at construction sites. Although legal actions should be taken in case of any infringement on the previous law, there is no violation thus the committee submitted a review saying that the constructions should not be suspended.

In addition, draft of Kayin State's Systematic Production of Natural Fertilizers Law and additional subsections to Fresh Water Fisheries Law were discussed.
